| Activity | Description | When will this take place? | Link to Gatsby Benchmark |
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| Careers skills and guidance | Each student will discuss options for careers and post 16 options with their form tutor each term. Students have access to a range of resources on post 16 options in form time. This includes START, an online programme which matches students' interests and skills to potential careers, as well as literature on FE provision and apprenticeships. | Term 1, 2 and 3 | 1,2, 3,8 |
| Careers interview | Students have the opportunity to meet with the Careers advisor to discuss post 16 options and seek guidance where required. Continued guidance will be directed to students at risk of not being in education, employment or training when they leave. | Term 2 and 3 | 2, 3, 8 |
| Parents' Day | Careers advisor available at Parents' Day to offer advice and guidance to parents and students regarding careers and post 16 opportunities. | Term 1 | 2, 8 |
| Apprenticeship workshops | Students have the opportunity to visit the National Apprenticeship Show and meet prospective providers as well as attending workshops within school from local colleges regarding opportunities in this area. | Term 1 and 2 | 7 |
| Careers Fair | Students have the opportunity to speak to a range of employers and FE providers | Term 2 | 6 |
| FE visits and taster sessions | Students have the opportunity to visit local colleges and take part in taster sessions at local colleges linked to the courses they have expressed an interest in pursuing. | Term 1 and 2 | 5, 7 |

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| Work experience | Students have the opportunity to visit work places and meet employers, both as part of the curriculum and as Careers events. | Term 2 and 3 | 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7 |
| CV writing and employability skills | In form time, students will complete an Achieve module to prepare them for next steps, which includes learning about the skills essential for work and CV writing. | Term 2 | 4, 5 |
| Post 16 provider talk | A range of post 16 providers will visit school to talk to groups. This includes information about the types of courses they offer and different routes students can take. Typically, this includes Wakefield College, Leeds College of Building and the Employment Hub. | Term 2 | 7 |
