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80% of pupils who left Enrich Academy in 2023 went onto a sustained destination compared with 82.6% of mainstream pupils nationally (2022 data).

 20% of pupils who left Enrich Academy in 2023 are NEET - 63% female and 37% male pupils. This compares nationally with 4% females and 3% males.

Overall nationally the sustained destination rate increased in 2021/22; following a decline the previous year, higher proportions of students went into apprenticeships and employment in 2021/22.



- Of this Year 11 cohort 17% of the pupil population had an EHCP. Of these pupils, 86% who left Enrich Academy in July 2023 went onto a sustained destination compared with 90% of EHCP pupils nationally in 2021.
- 73% of PP & CLA pupils who left Enrich Academy in 2023 went onto a sustained destination. The national data collection method does not allow for a like for like comparison however 87.7% of disadvantaged pupils* nationally in 2022 went onto a sustained destination.
- The attendance rate for the majority of the pupils in the NEET category was around 30% in Key Stage 4.
